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1 Allen Matkins Leck Gamble Mallory & Natsis LLP ("Allen Matkins"),
2 general counsel for Thomas A. Seaman ("Receiver"), the court-appointed Permanent
3 Receiver for Medical Capital Holdings, Inc., Medical Capital Corporation, Medical
4 Provider Funding Corporation VI, and their subsidiaries and affiliates (collectively,
5 the "Receivership Entities"), submits this Sixteenth Interim Application for approval
6 and payment of fees and reimbursement of expenses. This application covers the
7 period August 1, 2013 through October 31, 2013 ("Sixteenth Interim Period").

8 Allen Matkins seeks interim approval of \$171,670.50 in fees and \$11,746.92
9 in expenses incurred during the Sixteenth Interim Period. Allen Matkins asks that
10 the Receiver be authorized to pay 80% of the requested fees, or \$137,336.40, and
11 100% of the requested expenses. In light of the Court's prior comments, Allen
12 Matkins has carefully reviewed its invoices with an eye toward providing the best
13 possible value to the receivership estate and has made significant adjustments to
14 such invoices. Because of the resolution of certain matters and the change in its fee
15 arrangement as to the Sedgwick matter to a contingency fee, Allen Matkins' fee
16 request herein is **less than half the amount** requested in the Fifteenth Interim Fee
17 Application recently approved by the Court. Allen Matkins expects that future
18 application amounts will be similarly reduced.

19 The Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") has reviewed this
20 Sixteenth Interim Fee Application, along with the Fee Application set for hearing
21 concurrently herewith filed by the Receiver. The SEC does not oppose this
22 Sixteenth Interim Fee Application.

23 **I. INTRODUCTION.**

24 On August 18, 2009, the Court entered the Preliminary Injunction and Order
25 Appointing a Permanent Receiver ("Appointment Order"), making the Receiver's
26 appointment permanent. Section VI of the Appointment Order empowers and
27 directs the Receiver to engage and employ attorneys to (1) assist in investigation and
28 discovery as may be necessary to locate and account for assets of or managed by the

1 Receivership Entities, and (2) investigate and, where appropriate, to institute,
2 pursue, and prosecute all claims and causes of action of whatever kind and nature as
3 a result of the activities of the employees or agents of the Receivership Entities. The
4 Receiver immediately engaged Allen Matkins to serve as his general counsel.

5 With the assistance of Allen Matkins, the Receiver has worked diligently and
6 effectively during the Sixteenth Interim Period to preserve and protect the
7 receivership estate, and maximize the value and recovery from the various
8 receivership assets.

9 The Receiver and his team have utilized numerous strategies to reduce the
10 amount of attorneys' fees incurred as the case proceeds, including the use of
11 additional junior attorneys and paralegals as appropriate. While the fees and costs
12 incurred by Allen Matkins during this Sixteenth Interim Period were significant, the
13 time and effort of Allen Matkins attorneys were necessary to preserve the
14 receivership estate (e.g. address a lawsuit against the Receiver relating to the Trace
15 nuclear facility in Texas) and maximize the recovery from receivership assets. By
16 this Fee Application, Allen Matkins respectfully requests to be compensated for the
17 services provided during the Sixteenth Interim Period.

18 **II. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF TASKS PERFORMED BY ALLEN**
19 **MATKINS DURING THE SIXTEENTH INTERIM PERIOD.**

20 This case requires significant, complex legal work across a broad spectrum of
21 activities, including preserving assets, collecting debts, analyzing and pursuing
22 claims against third parties (including against attorneys and other professionals),
23 negotiating and documenting complex transactions, addressing environmental
24 issues, and obtaining Court approval of various actions by the Receiver. The
25 following is an overview of Allen Matkins' work in significant matters affecting the
26 Receivership Estate during the Sixteenth Interim Period. Further detail is contained
27 within this Fee Application, as well as in the Receiver's monthly reports to the
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1 Court. Allen Matkins provided crucial and continuous hands-on assistance to the
2 Receiver on numerous legal matters, including:

- 3 • **Claims/Third Party Recoveries:** Allen Matkins incurred significant
4 fees during the Sixteenth Interim Period assisting the Receiver in
5 obtaining, analyzing and reporting third party recovery information
6 obtained from noteholders and their representatives. Allen Matkins had
7 extensive contact with noteholders and/or their counsel to obtain
8 noteholder recovery information to either verify or dispute amounts
9 reported by noteholders. Allen Matkins filed various reports and
10 pleadings with the Court addressing third party recovery issues and
11 resolved numerous disputes and open issues with noteholders. Allen
12 Matkins participated in a hearing on August 12, 2013, concerning third
13 party offsets, and provided extensive assistance thereafter to the
14 Receiver and his team to resolve open offset issues per the Court's
15 instruction, including the preparation and filing of a final report to the
16 Court as to proposed offset amounts. Allen Matkins also assisted the
17 Receiver in addressing the claim submitted by the IRS, resulting in a
18 stipulation with the IRS that was approved by the Court. Finally, Allen
19 Matkins worked with class and mass action counsel to resolve offset
20 issues and facilitate distribution of trustee settlement funds.
- 21 • **Interstate Restoration Litigation:** On May 2, 2013, Interstate
22 Restoration LLC filed an action against the Receiver in the Central
23 District, asserting various causes of action and seeking damages of over
24 \$900,000. The action involves the Receiver's sale of a loan made to
25 Trace Life Sciences, Inc. ("Trace") secured by Texas property,
26 including a radiochemical manufacturing facility, and restoration work
27 performed by the plaintiff at the property. During the Sixteenth Interim
28 Period, Allen Matkins provided extensive assistance to the Receiver as

1 to both formal and informal discovery, including Rule 26 disclosures
2 and the informal exchange of documents. Allen Matkins conducted a
3 review of numerous documents for production and identified privilege
4 issues. The Court granted the Receiver's Motion to Dismiss on October
5 9, 2013. Allen Matkins reviewed the Court's order, as well as the
6 amended complaint filed by Interstate, and began preparation of a
7 Motion to Dismiss the Amended Complaint.

- 8 • **Lavipharm:** Allen Matkins assisted the Receiver in analyzing the
9 complex intellectual property collateral securing this substantial
10 defaulted loan to Lavipharm Laboratories, Inc. and Lavipharm
11 Corporation (collectively, "Lavipharm"), which has a current principal
12 balance owed of over \$24 million. The loan is secured by various
13 assets, including rights in certain patents for medical delivery systems
14 Allen Matkins worked with an expert concerning a valuation of the
15 borrower's IP assets, and evaluated strategies to maximize the recovery
16 on the loan. Allen Matkins also conducted negotiations with a potential
17 third party purchase for the interest in Lavipharm.
- 18 • **Reporting:** Allen Matkins assisted the Receiver in compiling the
19 information necessary to prepare and draft his 49th, 50th and
20 51st Interim Reports to the Court.

21 **III. FEE APPLICATION.**

22 With respect to its work performed during the Sixteenth Interim Period, Allen
23 Matkins requests approval of \$171,670.50 in fees and \$11,746.92 in expenses. For
24 ease of review, Allen Matkins has categorized the time billed by its professionals as
25 follows:

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A. Fees Requested (\$171,777.50)

Allen Matkins seeks approval of \$171,670.50 in fees, which are categorized in the table below.¹ Detailed descriptions of each category of fees and a break-down of hours by professional are also included below.

I. Investigation / Reporting [298591-00004] (7.5 hours)

This category contains time spent investigating, analyzing and providing legal advice as to the operations, transactions and assets of the Receivership Entities and recovering documents, records and other information regarding the business and assets of the Receivership Entities. During the Sixteenth Interim Period, Allen Matkins assisted the Receiver with respect to gathering information for and preparing three monthly reports to the Court.

2. Third Party Claims [298591-00008] (44.4 hours)

This category contains time spent analyzing and prosecuting claims on behalf of the receivership estate. Pending actions Allen Matkins assisted the Receiver with include the Receiver's claims against Pyramid Technologies, Inc. ("Pyramid"), Anthony Macaluso/ TEEM, LLC ("TEEM"), and Valley Health Care ("VHC").

The Receiver filed a case against Pyramid Technologies in which summary judgment in favor of the Receiver was granted, and the parties stipulated to dismiss the remaining claims in the complaint. The defendants filed a Notice of Appeal on January 6, 2012. One of the owners of Pyramid filed for bankruptcy and Allen Matkins provided advice to the Receiver concerning bankruptcy issues, including participation in a debtor's examination, and preparation of a complaint contesting the dischargeability of the debt. During the Sixteenth Interim Period, Allen Matkins handled various aspects of the adversary proceeding, including preparation of various discovery responses and review of related documents. Allen Matkins also participated in meet and confer efforts and motion practice concerning discovery disputes.

As to the Receiver's claims against VHC, Allen Matkins advised the Receiver regarding collection options, including pursuit of a new action. Allen Matkins also prepared the pleadings and related documents for such action.

B. Expenses Requested (\$11,746.92)

Allen Matkins also requests that the Court approve \$11,746.92 in expenses. A summary of the expenses by matter is contained in the charts above, and are consolidated for the Court's convenience below. Allen Matkins charges \$0.15 per page for copies and \$2.00 per page on outgoing faxes only. No charge for incoming faxes is included. Messenger fees include hand delivery charges and federal express or other overnight services. The urgency of many matters and the volume of interested parties to whom service of pleadings and other notices were required made overnight services the only practical alternative in many instances. In addition, certain of the pleadings were voluminous.

Copying charges and mail expenses likewise reflect the large volume of parties involved in certain matters, and the Receiver's goal to provide as much information as possible to interested parties. Travel expenses were incurred by Allen Matkins attorneys when their attendance was required at Court hearings and other litigation proceedings.

During the Sixteenth Interim Period, substantial expenses were incurred with respect to document productions in the Sedgwick matter.

IV. CONCLUSION.

Allen Matkins has worked diligently to assist the Receiver in fulfilling his assigned duties, and has provided valuable service to the Receivership estate during this Fifteenth Interim Period. Therefore, pursuant to the legal authorities cited in Allen Matkins' First Interim Fee Application, and this Court's power to approve the requested interim fees and expenses, Allen Matkins respectfully requests an order:

1. Approving and allowing fees totaling \$171,670.50 for the Sixteenth Interim Period;
2. Approving and allowing reimbursement of costs totaling \$11,746.92 for the Fifteenth Interim Period;
3. Authorizing the Receiver to pay 80% of the allowed amount of Allen Matkins' fees, which amount is \$137,336.40.
4. Authorizing the Receiver to pay 100% of the allowed amount of Allen Matkins' costs, which amount is \$11,746.92 and
5. For other and further relief as is appropriate.
